### 30<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION REDSTONE PRESBYTERIAN SENIORCARE

WHEREAS, Redstone Presbyterian SeniorCare is celebrating thirty years of valuable service to the community; and

WHEREAS, Redstone Presbyterian SeniorCare, formerly known as the Greensburg Home of the Presbytery of Redstone, began in 1976 by members of the First Presbyterian Church of Greensburg who received word that the elderly residents in the Home for the Aged in Greensburg would be discharged due to costly building changes required to meet state safety regulations; and

WHEREAS, the word spread within the Presbytery and soon there was a large group of caring individuals devoted to seeing that those residents who had been uprooted would join other seniors in a new home to be built by the Presbytery. The volunteer planners persevered from initial ground-breaking to the dedication ceremonies, which welcomed the new facility's first residents on February 18, 1980; and

WHEREAS, for thirty years, the mission of this new home was to provide care to older adults in need and provide benevolent care to residents who outlived their financial resources. Today, under the name Redstone Highlands, the mission of service to provide quality care and expanded supportive housing options continues. On December 28, 2001 a second Redstone Highlands community opened its doors to residents in North Huntingdon. On May 6, 2002, a third community opened its doors to residents in Murrysville. The expansion of Redstone Highlands is reflective of its mission to offer high quality services to the changing needs of the community.

THEREFORE, we the Commissioners of Westmoreland County, Tom Balya, Tom Ceraso and Charles W. Anderson, do hereby congratulate Redstone Presbyterian SeniorCare upon the momentous occasion of its thirtieth anniversary and commends its mission to offer high quality services to the changing needs of the seniors in Westmoreland County and offer our best wishes for continued success of such a vital endeavor in years to come.
